DON'T MISS OUT! PROVINCIAL 400 CLUB TOURNAMENT \$1000 PRIZE FUND INCREASE

To be eligible to participate at no additional charge, bowlers must be regular league members in a Bowl BC member centre. Invitees who do NOT participate in regular league play at a member centre will be charged an entry fee of \$125 plus GST. Bowlers who are not currently bowling but have been invited to the event based on their achievement of bowling a perfect game are exempt from this rule.

The Provincial finals will be held at Grandview Lanes, Vancouver. The prize pool is very attractive and winners will be declared in both scratch and pinsover-average divisions.

Once again this year there will be an added prize draw of **A YEAR OF LINEAGE FOR ONE LEAGUE!** All participants will be entered into a draw for lineage. *Must be present at time of draw to win* *Lineage is valid for a member centre only*
